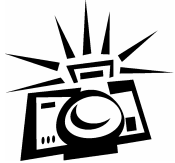
PRESCHOOL PIPELINE

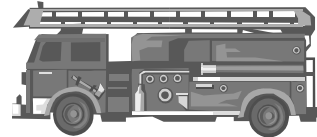
A fire drill is planned this month. The safety and security of the children is our utmost priority. Please help us insure that by keeping your child close to you when entering and exiting the parking lot.
